Replacement of first key personnel will be subject to a penalty on the payment remaining to be paid. The penalty will be 5% for first replacement (on payments made from the date of replacement till completion of contract).</p> <p>vii. In case of the next replacement and so on, the penalty will increase at sole discretion of JNARDDC. The overall penalties will not exceed more than 10% of the overall contract value in any case.</p> <p>Illustration: Say on date of first replacement, INR 20 lakhs (of total contract value of say 1 Crore) has already been paid, and 80 lakhs is pending to be paid, a 5% penalty on the remainder 80 lakh amount will be levied which will be 4 lakhs. Say next replacement is made when 50 lakhs has been paid, and JNARDDC determines the increased penalty to be 10%, then 10% penalty would be made on the remainder 50 lakhs which will be 5 lakhs. Therefore total penalty would be 4+5=9 lakhs.</p>
